SPIN clubs are led by volunteers who have a passion for learning and want to share their knowledge with young people.

#### When and Where Will the Club Meet?

SPIN clubs are planned around the volunteer's availability. A club meets for at least one hour, six or more times per year. Meeting dates are selected by the volunteer, based on participants' availability. The meeting location is chosen for the type of activity and number of participants.

Your Time Commitment	<ul> <li>Participate in volunteer orientation and training</li> <li>Coordinate a minimum of six meetings based on your availability</li> <li>Plan learning activities and identify needed supplies</li> <li>Discuss your SPIN Club experience with 4-H staff</li> <li>Devote 15 to 20 hours total</li> </ul>
Your Responsibilities as a 4-H Volunteer	<ul> <li>Decide what skills the club members should learn</li> <li>Identify safety issues and make plans to keep youth safe</li> <li>Provide leadership and decision-making opportunities within the club</li> <li>Guide members as they learn new knowledge and skills</li> <li>Be a role model by accepting and valuing all members</li> <li>Work with members to plan an event so they can demonstrate their learning to others</li> <li>Help youth identify ways to give back to their community</li> </ul>
How to Get Started	<ul> <li>Complete the volunteer application forms, including the background check and how to reach references</li> <li>Schedule an orientation with Extension 4-H staff</li> </ul>
We Will Help You Help Youth	<ul> <li>Extension 4-H staff will provide:</li> <li>Face-to-face and online training to prepare you for your volunteer experience</li> <li>Assistance planning learning activities</li> <li>Insurance to cover liability and accidents</li> <li>Assistance in materials, supplies, or equipment</li> </ul>
