

## 4-H CLUB PLAN OF WORK

**(Suggested format. Make up your own if you prefer)**

In order to meet your goals for the year, you need to do some pre-planning. Your club's written plans for the year are called your "Plan of Work". Involve club members in developing the "Plan". A committee of members and leaders may do the planning, then report to the club for final approval. Your "Plan of Work" should be made out in duplicate with one copy for the club. Send the other to the County Extension Educator by the end of November of each 4-H year.

This initial "Plan of Work" is tentative, and changes may be made as the year progresses. But if plans are made now to include the meetings and activities which the club wants to do, they will not be forgotten and will be more likely to succeed. And the "Plan of Work" will keep us all better informed about your club's plans and activities.

## 2 GOALS

6. Judging Contest/work on Records  Date: April 5	Discussion where to go on tour, elect committees needed for tour and picnic
7. Evaluation of Projects  Date: May 3	Make final plans for tour and picnic
8. Tour and Family Picnic  Date: June 2	Swimming, clean up picnic area and beach for community project.

Regular meetings of the club are basically to take care of the business at hand and to work together and have fun as a group. Clubs are required to also do a community service project, a family activity and a health or safety program during the year, (see 4-H Club Standards). In addition to the samples above, other meetings might include field trips, movies, project work meetings, learning new games and songs, or anything else of interest.
