

ABOUT THE TALK:

Debates over a basic income often split working people: many welcome economic security, yet worry about others “getting something for nothing.” This talk challenges that tension by showing why a basic income guarantee can strengthen workers’ bargaining power, stabilize communities, and support a fairer economy. Drawing on his extensive research and policy analyses of carbon dividends and economic democracy, Dr. Howard’s talk makes the case for basic income as a pro-worker reform.

MEET OUR SPEAKER:

Mike Howard is Emeritus Professor of Philosophy and an External Associate of the Climate Change Institute at the University of Maine. He was president of the US Basic Income Guarantee Network and co-editor of the journal *Basic Income Studies*. He co-edited two books on Alaska's Permanent Fund Dividend, and currently co-chairs the Maine Basic Income Security Committee.
