- Proper Shot placement
- Basic game care
- Maine hunting laws and regulations
- Where to hunt: public and private lands

- Types of common firearms
- Action types of rifles
- Differences between bullet calibers
- Choosing the right firearm for hunting or target shooting
- How to store and secure your firearms.

This workshop will be a blend of hands-on demonstration, practice, and live fire exercises led by professional staff and range safety officers. You will soon be prepared for the upcoming season whether it's hunting, or a day at the range. This is great for the new hunter or shooter, and an excellent refresher for experienced folks.

- Learn to Hunt - Turkey Hunting:

Whether you are new to hunting, or simply looking to expand your hunting activities, Maine is the perfect place to hunt wild turkeys. Maine boasts strong populations of birds nearly statewide and there's plenty of access and opportunities to hunt this wary gamebird. In this workshop we'll cover the habits and habitats of turkeys, equipment that includes decoys, calls, ground blinds, and other gear, and how to dress for success. We'll spend time practicing calling and you will receive a free turkey call to get you started. We'll then move to shotgun patterning and you'll have a chance to shoot various shot sizes and various distances to get a hands on understanding of shot pattern and effective ranges. By the end of this workshop, you'll be ready to hit the wood and fields this spring!

Learn tracking and wildlife identification along the way, and see some amazing forest features too. Bring the camera, because you may just catch a glimpse of just who left those tracks ahead!

- Map and Compass:

GPS use is on the rise, but basic map and compass skills are the key to navigation in the back-country. Learn how to read topographic maps and put a compass to use. Orient a map, set a bearing, and set a course, and soon you'll find out how much fun it is! We'll cover triangulation, declination compensation, and route planning.
