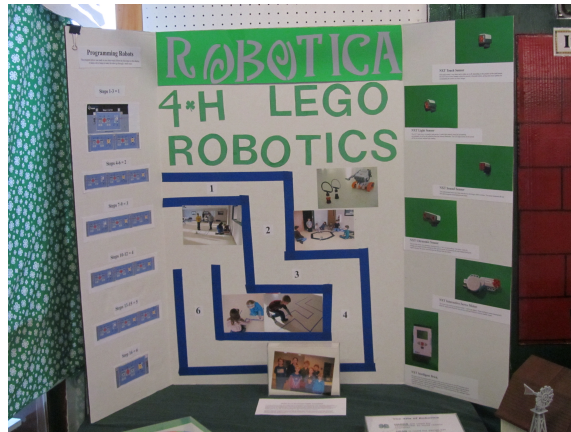
Club Exhibits should illustrate some phase of 4-H Club work. The main idea behind a Club Exhibit is to provide the club the opportunity to display as a total unit. Clubs should be thinking of this throughout the club year. It may be helpful to capture the work you are doing by saving photos or other “display friendly” materials. This is a great role for an assistant leader or parent volunteer.



Club displays should fit in the space of a card table. Clubs are responsible for bringing all the materials needed for display, including a table.

Be creative! Share what you have been working on in a way that is eye catching.





Display has a clear title with name of club, and description of type of club.



Use space wisely. If you have space, you may want to cover the table-top, with a tablecloth and/or display items, to help demonstrate what your project is.

Judging

Projects need to be displayed and ready for judging by noon on Saturday prior to the fair.

- Set up is Saturday 9am-noon.
- Pick up for displays is 9 am-noon at the close of the fair on the Sunday.

Club exhibits are the only exhibits judged competitively (not using the Danish system). Judging criteria is as follows:

- *Up to 30 points – Theme*
- *Up to 20 points – Workmanship*
- *Up to 20 points – Creativity*
- *Up to 15 points – Presentation*
- *Up to 15 points – Overall Appearance*
