Hancock County Home Horticulture Programs adapt and continue heartily through COVID-19:

- *Master Gardener Volunteer training* continues to be taught weekly via ZOOM video conferencing.
- Garden Chats: Growing Resilience from the Ground Up. These 1-hour sessions are held every Monday at 9:00 AM, Wednesday at 12:00 PM, and Thursday at 6:00 PM via ZOOM.
- *Victory Gardens for ME*, an 8-part YouTube Video Series has been launched, especially for the Beginning Gardener. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=CcjH4BwseZq
- **Gardening for Wildlife** ~ UMaine Cooperative Extension and Maine Audubon are offering a free online course on making your landscape more beautiful as well as beneficial to wildlife.
- Home and Commercial Horticulture Questions are being answered, and Soil Testing services provided.
- Beginning Gardener Mentorships, one-on-one phone/email/Zoom mentorships are now available!

Hancock County Food Security Programs

- Distributing hundreds of donated vegetable seed packets to local food pantries in Hancock County.
- Providing seeds and guidance to Master Gardener Volunteers to plant vegetables at home for donation to those in need.
- Growing over 1,000 vegetable seedlings to produce food for clients of food pantries and soup kitchens.

Hancock County *4-H Youth Development Programs* are continuing through COVID-19 and are more important than ever:

- 4-H Public Speaking (virtual completed on April 25 and was a huge success)
- 4-H Egg Business Project (virtual ongoing through fall)
- 4-H June Jamboree (at-home, hands-on projects and virtual Animal Science programs)
- Kids Can Grow (providing seeds & support to youth home gardeners in collaboration with Master Gardener Volunteers - ongoing through fall)
- 4-H Aquaculture: redesigning this program to support at-home aquaponics projects (expected to launch July 2020)
- 4-H Aquaponics: supporting local teachers in transitioning the project from their physical to remote classrooms
- Style Revue, our annual 4-H sewing contest, is postponed to October

Hancock County Extension Homemakers are:

- Sewing facemasks for the group, *Sewing Masks for Maine*, a statewide volunteer effort that provides homemade face masks to health care providers. The University of Maine Cooperative Extension Office in Hancock County is a registered drop-off location.
- Connecting with local 4-H youth through written letters.
- The MEHC Board Meeting is moved to June 22nd due to ongoing COVID 19 recommendations and concerns.
