



Biosecurity List for the Checkout

- ☐ Washable boots
- ☐ Disposable boots/shoe covers for visitors
- ☐ Boot brush or boot scrub
- ☐ Tubs to clean and disinfect boots: Scrub off all debris with water and rinse off all debris; immerse in disinfectant bath.
- ☐ Disinfectants (examples – follow dilution rate/contact time)
 - ☐ Bleach (Sodium Hypochlorite)
 - ☐ Virkon (Peroxygen)
 - ☐ Nolvasan (Chlorexidine)
- ☐ Disinfectants (examples – follow dilution rate/contact time)
- ☐ Soap and hand sanitizers
- ☐ Coveralls: designated for use with your livestock
