# Meeting Minutes:

- Michelle Melaragno graciously agreed to chair the third meeting of the Coalition. She led introductions around the room and conference call attendees and reiterated the basic ground rules of our group.
- The minutes from the April meeting were discussed, with one change made. On the mission statement discussion, the words "and other equids" were included to fully represent our discussion on using the word Equine in the mission statement to be as inclusive as possible. Minutes were then accepted by majority vote.
- Michelle Reported out that the Group Structure Subcommittee has not yet had the opportunity to meet. The group plans to meet as soon as possible and will present their ideas and proposals to the full Coalition at the June 16th meeting. The subgroup will also focus on getting a treasurer into place as quickly as possible.
- The group held a brief discussion on an interim chair person, to fill the role until annual meetings have been established and we hold our first one, with election of new officers. Potential names suggested were Janelle Tirrell, Michelle Melaragno and Missy Libby. Since attendance was lower at this meeting, it was agreed that we use a new survey to gather more nominees from other interested individuals, with further discussion and voting at the June 16<sup>th</sup> meeting.
- We next had a discussion on the formal name of our group. Many agreed that the current working name has a lot of recognition already. Others had suggestions for how to tweak that name to make it representative of our work and as inclusive as possible. The group decided to give one more opportunity for feedback on this issue as well, so name can be suggested in the survey and we will have further discussion at the June 16<sup>th</sup> meeting.
- Most of the meeting was spent in a brainstorming session for subcommittee tasks. The survey also has space for additional subcommittee task suggestions, which will all be reviewed, tweaked and prioritized starting at the June meeting. The brainstormed tasks were as follows:

#### Public Awareness and Education

Review currently available info and identify voids

Provide access to currently available info

Explore media options- public access channel, events, fairs, trainings

Work on publications- website, brochure

Obtain advertising space- Blue Seal stores, Tractor Supply Company, shelters, etc...

Create educational courses and host trainings

Outreach to parents- 4-H clubs, Pony Clubs, girl scouts, etc...

Outreach to kids camps with educational material

Educate non-horse people, neighbors, friends

Collaborate with shelters and learn about their experiences

Create and maintain a speakers bureau

Create and spread the word with sign-up sheets to get involved

## Political Action and Legal Issues

Work on liability issues as encountered in subcommittees' work

Work with all other subcommittees to resolve any legal issues

Work with other agencies/organizations to influence state-wide policy

Provide assistance in appropriate manner on "incorrigibles" who do not accept education

Monitor and influence legislative bills and actions

Prepare and present appropriate bill testimony

Identify designated spokesperson for group as a whole- Public Information Officer

Develop standards of record-keeping

Document the work of the Coalition
