Wilderness First Aid (WFA)

Taught by SOLO-Wilderness Emergency Medicine

Accidents happen. People get hurt, sick, or lost. The temperature drops, the wind picks up, and it starts to rain. Would you know what to do? Many back-country emergencies are preventable, and even when bad things happen, sometimes the wrong care can make things worse. By learning a few basic skills, you can make the difference between a good outcome and a bad one—and maybe even save a life. The two day Wilderness First Aid (WFA) course creates a solid foundation in the basics of back-country medical care.

<u>TRAINING</u>: All sessions will be conducted in the 4-H way - "learn by doing."

WHEN: 6/10/17-6/11/17 9:00 am – 5:30 pm.

<u>WHO</u>: WFA is the perfect course for the outdoor enthusiast or trip leader who wants a basic level of first aid training for short trips with family, friends, and outdoor groups. It also meets the ACA guidelines for summer camp staff.

COST:

Residential \$240.00, this includes food, lodging, and materials. Commuter \$200.00, this includes food and materials.

WHERE: Tanglewood 4-H Camp & Learning Center. Directions will be sent with confirmation.

LODGING: Lodging will be in our camp cabins (no heat). There are also motels and B&B's in the area if you wish to stay off site.



What is taught?

WFA is 16 hours long (two days), and focuses on the basic skills of

- Response and Assessment;
- Musculo-skeletal Injuries;
- Environmental Emergencies;
- Survival Skills;
- Soft Tissue Injuries; and
- Medical Emergencies
