To be eligible for this scholarship, applicants must meet the following requirements:

- Applicants must be high school seniors or graduates whose primary residence is in Waldo County.
- Applicants must be entering their first or second year of post-secondary education.
- Applicants must be pursuing a career in a field that supports the Cooperative Extension's mission "to help Maine people improve their lives through an educational process that uses research-based knowledge". Examples of eligible fields of study include, but are not limited to agriculture, horticulture, crop science, animal sciences, natural resource conservation, environmental sciences, home economics, nutrition, food systems, preventative health, health education, youth development, and early childhood/youth/adult education.

A single scholarship recipient will be announced by May 1st, with funds awarded following completion of a successful first semester.
